Graduate Education Research Grant Gold Winner

She currently serves as Associate Dean of Graduate Studies and faculty at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago.

The 2024 Future Leader Award goes to Alyssa Orlando



A career professional in graduate enrollment management, Dr. Alyssa Orlando currently serves as the Director of Graduate Admission at Clark University. In this role, she manages a team of dedicated professionals committed to enrolling strong, passionate candidates who uphold Clark's mission of challenging convention and changing the world. Prior to Clark, she worked at several other New England institutions in graduate admission and

marketing. Alyssa has served as a dedicated NEGAP and NAGAP volunteer since 2019 when she joined the NEGAP Professional Development committee. Since then, she has served on the NAGAP membership committee, and as NEGAP Secretary and Vice President. Alyssa will assume the NEGAP presidency on May 1 of this year.

In February, Alyssa defended her dissertation research exploring the relationship between institutional decision-making and potential bias within holistic master's admission processes. She holds a bachelor's degree in journalism from Ithaca College, a master's degree in higher education from Boston College, and will walk in two weeks to receive her Ph.D. in Educational Leadership at the University of Massachusetts Lowell. 
